Ming Chuan University Enforcement Rules for Chinese Proficiency Requirements

- With an aim to improve students' employment competitiveness, these regulations were established in accordance with Ming Chuan University Procedures for Proficiencybased Graduation Requirements.
- 2. Undergraduate students who are admitted in the 2010-11 academic year and beyond must meet the basic Chinese Proficiency requirement to be eligible to graduate.
- 3. Undergraduate students must pass the Chinese Proficiency requirement within the study period. The minimum requirements, categories and target students for Chinese Proficiency are as follows:

Category and Requirements	Target Students
Chinese Literature: Appreciation and Creative Writing II:	Undergraduate students
score 60 or above	Ondergraduate students
Basic Mandarin II: score 60 or above	Foreign students, Overseas
	Chinese students, and Hong
	Kong and Macao students who

Students studying in Applied Chinese Department should acquire higher examination scores than the minimum requirements. Specific requirements are established in other regulations.

- 4. Students who meet the minimum requirements for Chinese Proficiency should submit the original score result to the Applied Chinese Department for review. After completion of these procedures, the students will be verified as meeting the graduation requirements.
- 5. This regulation applies to students beginning with those who enter in the 2017-18 academic year and applies retroactively to students who entered in and prior to the 2016-17 academic year.

6. Upon being passed at the Department Affairs Committee Meeting, the School Affairs Committee Meeting, and the Academic Affairs Committee Meeting and approved by the president, these enforcement rules were announced and implemented. Any revision must follow the same procedures.

In the event of any inconsistency or discrepancy between the Chinese and other language versions of this document, the Chinese version shall prevail.
